Our initiatives include

Building teaching staff capability and capability in delivering effective teaching pedagogy with a focus on the P-6 Curriculum.

- Provide 100% of students with learning walls to support each curriculum including annotated assessment examples, success criteria and empowering them with the knowledge and skills necessary to achieve success.
- Developing teacher and teacher aide capability to embed feedback in the teaching and learning cycle through work shadowing and observations.
- Developing effective teaching and learning strategies to facilitate student learning within a multi-aged setting and are age-appropriate.
- Implementing a multi-tiered approach to curriculum delivery and intervention by triangulating data (diagnostic, formative and summative) for targeted teaching.
- Monitoring student progress through classroom observations, running records, writing samples, summative tasks and learning progression mapped using the P-10 Literacy Continuum.
- Personalised Learning Plans developed by the Student Support Team to address and cater for individual student learning.
